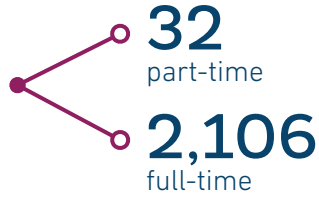

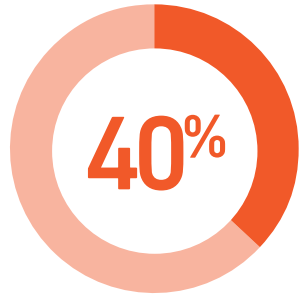

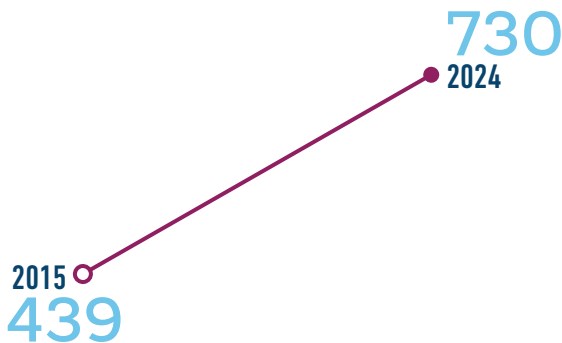
Fall 2024 enrollment

Percentage of all US students at Mac who are students of color



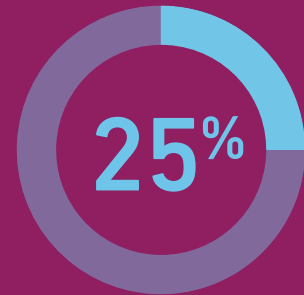
Enrollment of US students of color increased 66 percent

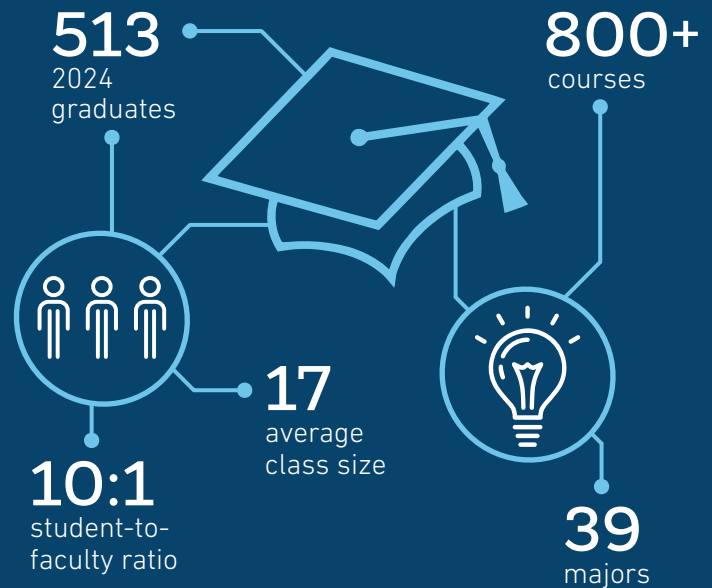
