

## Employment





Percent of Residents with Low Wage Employment\*, 2004, by Census Tract




In 2004, there were higher concentrations of residents with low-wage employment closer to Downtown

Percent of Residents with Low Wage Employment\*, 2006, by Census Tract



Change in Percent Employed in Services, 2004-06 by Census Tract




In North Minneapolis, the change in percent of residents employed in services varied greatly by census tract



 Access to bus routes and overall bus ridership in North Minneapolis is congruent with Minneapolis




 North Minneapolis shopping centers are serviced by fewer buses than Minneapolis shopping centers




#### North Minneapolis Students' School Choice (2008)



- Students residing within North Minneapolis generally go to school in or near that area
- Despite open enrollment policies, North Mpls retains community-style schools, save for a few outliers
- Students attending schools in North Mpls from outside the area have relatively small differences in FRL, ELL, and racial makeup






#### Acres of Green Space Per Person By Minneapolis Neighborhood

North Minneapolis residents are typically underserved in terms of access to green space


#### Acres of Green Space per Square Mile by Minneapolis Neighborhood


 Green space affects not only quality of life, but clearly impacts housing and economic fronts as well



Impacts of Places of Worship on Foreclosures, 2008



Foreclosure rates around places of worship appear to be lower in several cases than foreclosure rates in areas more distant from places of worship
