
Composite Results of Sketch Maps

Residents draw boundaries of their neighborhood on a provided sketch map
















































































Survey RespondentsBefore 2000StreetsStudy Area







Survey Respondents1990-2000StreetsStudy Area















Survey Respondents2001 to 2005StreetsStudy Area








