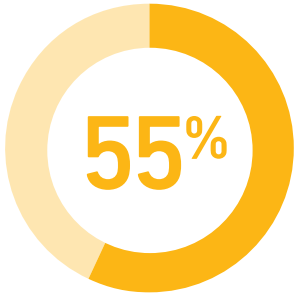
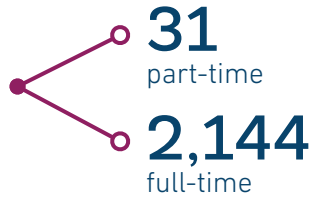

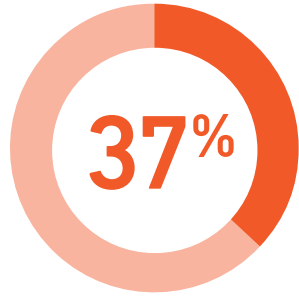

Percentage of all U.S. students at Mac who are students of color



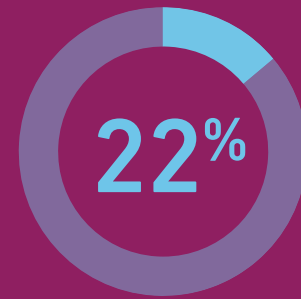

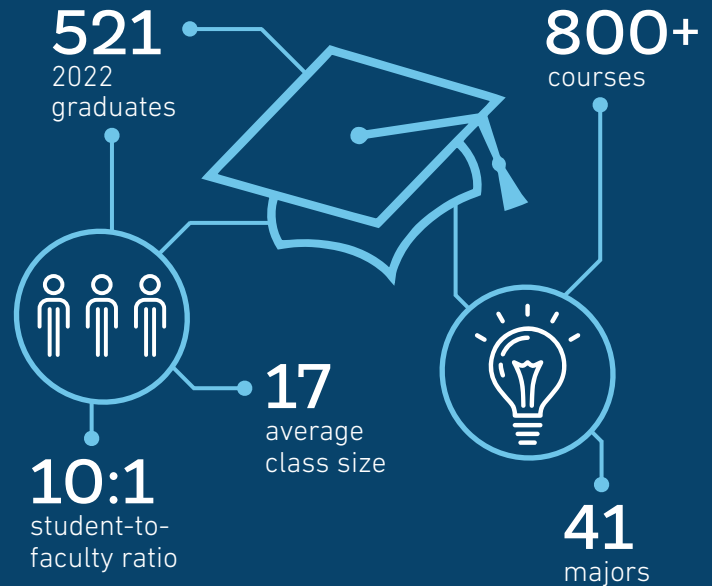
