

## Visiting Assistant Professor Psychology

The Macalester College Department of Psychology invites applications for a full-time (1.0FTE) non-tenure-track position at the rank of Visiting Assistant Professor to begin fall of 2025. We are seeking a specialist in either Social or Health Psychology. The ideal candidate will have a demonstrated commitment to excellence in teaching courses in their area of specialization.

ABD candidates will be considered; however, they must have their degree in hand prior to August 2025. This position is renewable for a second academic year, pending review of teaching. Visa sponsorship is not available for this position. In addition, candidates relying on an OPT Visa with a STEM extension are not eligible for hire.

The teaching load is five distinct courses per year, including courses at advanced, intermediate, and possible introductory levels. To apply, electronically submit a

- cover letter in which you identify possible courses you could teach
- evidence of commitment to excellence in teaching
- diversity statement (see below)
